A little bit of history...

Throughout the 18th and 19th centuries, the banks of the river Ouse were lined with warehouses, iron foundries, gasworks, timber yards, and even shipbuilding yards. The site of the John Harvey Tavern was occupied by the stables required to meet the coaching needs of the nearby Bear Hotel, which was destroyed by fire in 1918.

But not far away a new business had already been established. At the rear of The Cliffe Tavern, at the end of Bear Lane on the opposite corner to the Bear Hotel, John Harvey started brewing the beer that would mark Lewes in the 20th century as the home of Harvey's.

As Harvey's brewing business grew, the company moved to the present Bridge Wharf Brewery on the opposite side of Cliffe High Street, and during the 1980s, the stables were opened as a restaurant called The Weighed Inn. A fire in 1996 caused great damage to Harvey's premises, and the old Bear Lane stables became a temporary home for office staff.

In 1998, with Harvey's Bridge Wharf premises fully repaired, the Bear Lane site was re-opened as the John Harvey Tavern. Now established as the Harvey's Brewery Tap, The JHT serves beer fresh from the Brewery, with the biggest selections of Harvey's beers to be found in Sussex.
